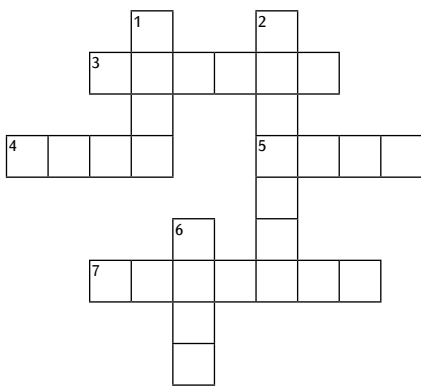

Most people know how to use social networking sites wisely, but this isn't always the case. In March 2011, Australian teenager Jessica Cooper posted an invitation to her 16th birthday party on Facebook. She was expecting her classmates from school to come and she invited them to bring a few other friends if they wanted to. But she made two big mistakes: she set her private party as a 'public event', and she included her address and mobile phone number in her post. The next day she was horrified to find that around 1,900 people had accepted her invitation and her phone was full of messages from strangers.

Jess quickly removed the invitation, but her problems were just beginning. Someone had already copied her information and almost immediately the event was posted again, using a fake Facebook account in her name. This time it really went viral. By the following morning, 30,000 people had signed up to attend her party and the numbers were increasing every minute. By the time the fake account was shut down by Facebook a day later, more than 200,000 people had accepted the invitation and the event wall was crowded with messages about what they were going to do and bring. Even after the event had been deleted from Facebook, websites and blogs kept making up stories about the party, people were reproducing Jess's profile photo and photos of her house, and businesses were advertising 'Jess Cooper's party' T-shirts for sale.

For lots of people, this was a good joke, but for Jess it wasn't funny. 'I'm so scared,' she told a reporter at the time. Her birthday party, of course, was called off and her parents had to ask the police for protection on the night she had been planning to hold it. She had to close her Facebook and phone accounts, and she probably still feels embarrassed about the unwanted publicity she got in 2011.
